You may drop off prescription medication of any kind, over-the-counter medications, medication samples, pet medications, vitamins inhalers, medicated ointments and lotion, and liquid medications in leak-proof containers. You cannot drop off needles, syringes, lancets, thermometers, aerosol cans, IV bags, hydrogen peroxide, bloody or infectious waste, empty containers, or personal products (non-medicated shampoos, etc.). The drop off locations are Richland County Regional Solid Waste Management Authority, Bellville Police Department, Lexington Police Department, Plymouth Police Department, Shelby Police Department and Richland County Sheriff's office.

May 1st thru May 31st- CACY will be distributing FREE Deterra medication deactivation pouches to properly dispose of unwanted or expired prescription and over-the-counter medication.
