#### HOW THE MENTAL HEALTH LEVY HELPS THE COMMUNITY

- ⇒ The current mental health and recovery services levy in Richland County was passed in 1986 and renewed most recently in 2016.
- ⇒ We are placing a 1 mil, 10-year levy RENEWAL on the ballot for the November 4th election. This is **NOT** a new tax or a tax increase.
- ⇒ Over the past five years, the Board has received an average of \$2,218,256.42 in annual funding generated by the levy.

### 2024 BEHAVIORAL HEALTH SERVICE OVERVIEW: SUPPORTING YOUTH, ADULTS & FAMILIES

In 2024 the Richland County Mental Health and Recovery Services Board in collaboration with our partners served **10,714** unique individuals with **3,520** of them being youth (0-17) and 7,194 being adults (18+). Additionally, **16,899** individuals participated in prevention programs. The system jointly provided a variety of services to individuals including:

- 7,257 received Mental Health Treatment
- 2,453 received Substance Use Disorder Treatment
- 1,224 accessed Medication-Assisted Treatment
- ⋄ 1,144 utilized Harm Reduction programming
- 890 accessed Recovery Supports programming
- 29 pregnant women with substance use disorder were served
- 239 parents with substance use disorder and dependent children served
- 7,862 calls to the Helpline
